Administering Temporary First Aid

1. School personnel/Child Care Contractor (CCC) may administer first aid, but only in accordance with the items and procedures contained in the “First Aid Guide for School Emergencies” by the Virginia Department of Health.
2. The publication “First Aid Guide for School Emergencies” prepared by the Department of Education and Department of Health shall be kept in the health office area of schools and in a designated area within School Age Child Care (SACC). The principal and/or his designee(s) shall become familiar with procedures in this publication.
3. No medications shall be administered unless so prescribed by the physician and parent in accordance with Regulation 757-4, “Administering Medication.”
4. In serious emergencies, the patient shall not be moved and Emergency Medical Services shall be called by dialing 911. Refer to Regulation 758-1, “Emergencies.”
5. Student Injury Report (Form # 61582450187G) should be completed in accordance with Regulation 751-1, “Insurance.”
6. Parents shall be contacted by school staff and/or the CCC.
7. Gloves are recommended when encountering body fluids. Gloves are available in the schools’ health office and in first aid kits in the building.
8. Three full-time staff members to include the CCC in each building shall be trained in community first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation/AED, and epinephrine administration.

The Associate Superintendent for Student Learning and Accountability (or designee) is responsible for implementing and monitoring this regulation.
